John Ahlin, Jr. 1939-2012

John Ahlin, Jr., 73 of Boise died December 23, 2012 at home, just as he wished, after a tenacious battle with lung cancer.

John excelled at many sports and played at fullback for the Borah Lions on their Southern Idaho Conference 1959 Football

Championship team.

While in school, John helped his parents' with their business, Alpine Custom Meat Processing and Packing, especially during the Fall and hunting season. Many of Aggie and John's mouthwatering specialties emerged from the smoke house including kielbasa, salmon, duck, holiday ham, chorizos and venison salami.

His adventuresome zest for life included motorcycle racing and riding horses at a full gallop.

He was preceded in death by his parents and older sister, Mariorie Franks.

John worked as a Forest Fire Crew Boss just as the Boise Interagency Fire Center was

being organized.

The work he enjoyed the most included owning and operating construction equipment (Tonka Toys for big boys) and used those skills to the fullest while working for various contracting companies like Hinkles & McCoy, Owyhee Construction, Idaho Sand & Gravel, Volt, and Gilbert Western.

John was a co-founding partner in Das-co of Idaho and Northwest Construction in Phoenix, both util-

ity installation companies.

He is survived by his son, Justin Ahlin, of Boise; daughter, Stacy Ahlin Laird (Robert), Brentwood, Calif.; brother, Jerry Ahlin (Susan), Rancho Cordova, Calif.; three nieces and four nephews.
